Your Veteran will also be honored on Together We Served's "[Roll of Honor](#)".

### **Obtaining a Copy of Your Veterans Discharge Certificate**

*When your Veteran was discharged from service, he or she would have obtained a Discharge Certificate – generally called a DD-214 – see example on Page 3. This can be useful in helping you complete your Veteran's Military Service Page if your Veteran is unavailable. If you don't have a copy of your Veteran's Discharge Certificate, a copy may be requested at the following government website.*

## **GETTING STARTED**

### **Step 1 – First Gather Your Veteran’s Service Information Using This Help Guide**

- Gather your Veteran’s discharge certificate, if available, along with all service photos, medals and awards, insignia, badges and citations.
- Work with your Veteran to enter as much information as possible into the Help Guide. Mark all the medal ribbons, insignia and badges awarded. Scan discharge certificate and service photos to upload to their service page albums.
- Now you are ready to start building their Military Service Page which you can share with other family members.

### **Step 2 - Build Your Veteran’s Military Service Page On Together We Served**

- After joining Together We Served as a Family Member, enter all the information gathered on the Help Guide into your Veteran’s Military Service Page using the ‘Add’ button in each section. Need help? Our online Help Desk is just a click away!
- A complete service history will appear, with medal ribbons worn exactly as on uniform and all badges, insignia and unit patches correctly displayed.
- Add their photos to designated photo albums - an album is available for each event in their service career - boot camp, each assignment, combat mission etc. Click the Edit button in any category to add photos to an event in that category. eg a duty station in the Assignments category.
- Click on the ‘Shadow Box’ and ‘Mini-Plaque’ buttons on your Veteran’s Profile Page to view unique and beautifully illustrated presentations of your Veteran’s military service which can be shared or printed out and framed.

### **Step 3 - Capture Your Veteran’s Service Memories In Their Own Words**

- A unique feature of Together We Served is Service Reflections - your Veteran’s military memories which become an integral part of their ‘Shadow Box’.
- Service Reflections is an easy to complete self-interview designed to help your Veteran remember key people and events from their military service supported by photographs.
- Once their written Reflections is completed, your Veteran is well prepared to recount their military memories in a video record if you choose to do so.
- Using the Reflections Interview Questions to guide the session, record your Veteran remembering their service using any recording device - smartphone, tablet or video camera. You can now upload your video to YouTube and insert the link in the Reflections section of their Together We Served military service page for the most complete, and most shareable, record of your Veteran’s military history available.
